The famous Belgian painter Koen van den Broek is having his third solo exhibition in New York, and it's an important one. Van Den Broek: Fascination With Urban Sceneries

Koen van den Broek has a degree in Architectural Engineering and <u>his paintings mostly depict</u> <u>urban landscapes, streets and roads</u>. Aesthetically, he's influenced by photography and film – genre-wise, namely neo-noir and horror. These influences are very visible in his new works, where a lot of images look like they belong in a suspense film. These new works show the evolution of Van den Broek as an artist. His paintings are changing from an objective plan to a subjective one. The inspiration for that is drawn from the artist's recent commissioned work. Koen van den Broek has created scenographies for the Ballet of Flanders and the Belgian Opera
